



4 TYPES OF BURN FURNACES

- I. **Church Based:** This type of Burn operates mainly inside of one local church.
 - A. Positives
 1. You always have a place to meet
 2. You have the support, covering and encouragement of a local church.
 3. You have access to equipment and resources you need
 4. You stir and activate the people in your local church to pray and worship
 - B. Negatives
 1. Could be hard to rally people from other churches to the Burn
 2. Could be seen as a “one” church ministry

- II. **Fixed Location:** This type of Burn has a neutral, fixed location, outside of a church building. Many Burn communities have storefront buildings, or access to halls or venues for regular Burn events.
 - A. Positives:
 1. Neutral location makes it accessible for all groups and ministries to feel safe.
 2. Freedom to have creative environments
 - B. Negatives:
 1. Could have a tendency to make the Burn seem like a separate movement from the local church.

- III. **Event-Based:** These type of Burn Furnaces embed the Burn into other events, conferences or festivals in your community. For example, at a conference some may host a Burn during the entirety of the conference in a separate room. The Burn in the UK did several weeks of 24-7 worship and prayer during the Olympics, which became a catalyst for many burns to start.
 - A. Positives:
 1. Helps you connect to many different groups in and outside your city.
 2. Freedom to model the purity of the Burn to those coming.
 3. Free to change with the seasons.
 4. Becomes a catalyst to for others to start other Burn cities.
 - B. Negatives:
 1. Could possibly be only seen as an event.
 2. May not be sustainable because it needs an event to hook into.
 3. May be hard to create continuity and momentum.



IV. **Multi-Site:** This is the original model of the Burn where the Burn event will move to a different church or location every month

A. Positives

1. Creates unity in the church especially as you host the Burn in their church
2. Models the heart and vision of the Burn to many in your city
3. Gives you a passion for the churches you visit
4. Releases breakthrough in the churches of your community

B. Negatives:

1. It could be hard to find churches to host
2. You may have limitations with equipment and ability to be creative with your space
